


True Grit. Bob Birtwell and Tom Ailes were in top form against Rams last week

A TOUGH DAY OUT AT PARK LANE

Last weeks home defeat and first home defeat for a very long time was more of measure of where we are and how far we have come and what we still must do. There have not been many occasions previously at Park Lane, and this will include league games against the likes of Harlequins, Northampton Saints, Exeter Chiefs, Bristol and so on, where you will see such a well organised aggressive





defence supported by a withering clinical counter punch as shown by Rams last week.

Rams in their display demonstrated why they just missed out last season and putting our guests to one side today, why Rams will be the most fancied team in the league to win it this season. Listening to the preparation Rams had gone to and had put in place to counter Sedge on their first visit to Park Lane last week says more about our trajectory and where we then to be taken with such seriousness. Back handed compliment and high praise indeed.

Playing up hill first the visitors absorbed an expected first 11 minutes of pressure as Sedge attacked the Rams line time and time again with the same conclusion each time. Nothing. Rams defence was like a wall standing firm but on that eleventh minute we saw the other side to the Rams game a brilliant set of backs who ran in a brilliant try finished by Edward Hoadley and converted by Fraser Honey.

Sedge went back on the offensive and if you looked solely at the first half statistics of our territory and possessions, it would suggest very strongly Sedge were in the ascendancy, but the stats are what they are, not facts, and the facts were we were blunted once again by great defence, forcing Tigers flyhalf Warren Seals into a policy of to take points when you can as he narrowed the score with 2 penalties.


As the game moved into the end of the second quarter another big breakout by Rams saw them up the field putting Sedge under pressure. Discipline was key, and it was unfortunate for the inspirational Tom Ailes to have to take a ten-minute sit down on a yellow card at this stage of the game. Rams needed no other motivation to take advantage of the resulting penalty which saw a kick into the Tigers corner. A great line out followed and from it after several phases, Rams loose-head Niall Kidd went over for the second try which was converted.

A penalty by Rams Fraser Honey ended the half: Sedgley Park 6 Rams 17.

Whatever was said at half time by Tigers coaching team had the desired effect as straight from the start of the second forty Sedge had their opening try of the game when Matt Riley went over, and Warren Seals converted. Unfortunately for this Tigers rally, Rams had the best response when 4 minutes after our opener, Rams once again turned defence into attack and were clinical and ruthless exploiting a Tigers mistake as Rams hooker Max Hayman went over for their third try and converted once again by Fraser Honey.

As Sedge tried to ring the changes, Rams chose to do some ringing themselves as 10 minutes after the third try, the bonus point try came on 65 minutes when Rams second row Daniel Swain went over for the fourth





try with Fraser Honey adding the extras.

Sedge once again dug deep and upped the ante and with the introduction of hooker Danny Maher we went from lateral play to direct rugby and on 72 minutes, he went over for Tigers second try which was converted by Warren Seals. Game on? Maybe a repeat of the opening Richmond game comeback. Could happen again?

Sedge threw everything including the kitchen sink at Rams, but that defensive wall would not give ground. As we entered the dying embers of the game a Sedge breakout and race for the line saw a bizarre turn of events. With the line only 20 metres away and with a chasing tackler on his tail as well as one of the Tigers gasman in support the Tigers player chose to slow up to bring in the support player for what should have been a nailed on third try for Sedge. However, this tactic had the opposite effect. The Rams chasing defender got to Tigers ball carrier first and made a great tackle. The ball was lost and quickly thrown wide. It was kicked ahead and with Sedge now committed to numbers for the attack, with wrong numbers in the wrong places, we fell for the ultimate counter punch as Rams countered and ran the full length of the field to add the fifth and last try on 80 minutes by Henry Bird. The conversion was missed.

Sadly, had we ran in the last try the scoreline would have reflected the game better however I am biased! the fact remained however Rams are a very well organised outfit, and their win was well deserved. We sincerely wish them well for the season.

For Sedge it was lesson learned. Its all about small margins and when it mattered Rams were able to pick up on the slightest mistake and hurt. Overall, there was no disgrace in defeat. We did measure up in all departments which will be important today as we have to do it all again against a Chinnor side who pushed Rams hard recently.

A MIGHTY BIG WIN





RAMS RUGBY FOOTBALL CLUB HISTORY

Chinnor RFC was formed in 1962, by Frank Angel, Cyril Perry and Marcus Cann, at 'the Bird in Hand' pub in Chinnor. They played their first game the following year. The 1970s saw the club expand to include junior and youth teams and in 1976 the club won the Oxfordshire Cup.

When the English league system started the club was placed in Bucks and Oxon Division 1 and have progressed through the Southern Counties section to gain promotion to the National Leagues in 2006; the youngest club to do so. The club gained a further promotion from National League 3 South West in 2012. During the 2016–17 National League 2 South season, the club achieved a record attendance at Kingsey Road of 1,580 during a top of the table clash against Bishop's Stortford. A game Chinnor won 27–25.


Firstly, I would like to say a big thank you to all our sponsors. Without your continued support we could really not run this club.



DAVE'S DIARY




