On behalf of the committee and all the playing and support staff it is a privilege to welcome everyone today, especially our old friends from Sale FC to Park Lane today.

So, with league points and position on offer, with derby bragging rights for the winning team, not much on offer then today? There is a lot on the line for both teams. Certainly not for the fainthearted that's for sure, as we head for a classic old school mash up. I can't wait!

So, we welcome Sale FC once again to Park Lane for our seventh league game against them. Will it be a lucky seven day for Sedge or Sale. No doubt we will find out at 17–00 hours later today.

We first met Sale FC back on the 28th of November 2015 at Park Lane in National League Two North following Sale's reintroduction into league structures and there resulting propulsion up the league levels. That first game we won 17–13 in a

tight typical derby game. In the game at Heywood Road, Sedge showed all their additional experience (in Modern day terms) of league rugby and won 15–30.

We continued to play Sale at this level, National League Two North, for another 2 more seasons going on to win one of the last 4 games.

Fixtures ended with Sale FC on the 23rd of December 2017 in tightly fought game on a mud bath of a pitch at Heywood Road. It was the proverbial slugfest of a game with Chris Johnson's boot being the difference. Great game, great day and a sadly missed fixture. What no one knew on the day was in the final reckoning that season, Sale finished top on 131 points to second placed Sedge on 126 points. Ouch!!!!

Alas, with Sale on the continuation of their upwardly mobile trajectory, they





took the next step up to the dizzy heights of National One in their stride and last season they nearly went one better just missing out on promotion to Championship being gazumped by Cambridge.

It seems strange talking about Sale FC as 'the continuation of their upwardly mobile trajectory' or 're-introduction of Sale FC to league rugby', when they have been one of the stalwarts of Northern rugby for many decades, and rightly so. On the formation of league rugby they were one of the highest placed teams in the very height of league rugby back in the mid-eighties.

Sale is a very old club (1861) hence the FC tag going back to the times when the rules / laws of the game where at best made up as they went along or very confused (It's good to see some consistency is still alive and kicking!!) and it wasn't until hacking was banned in football leading to the 'Rugby Football Club' qualification tag which now follows most club names.

It is fair to say, Sale had played a huge part in the development of the game up and beyond that earlier initial point. They were one of the originators of the rules of the game, with the early 10 rules to be followed by all players, which was recorded, documented and referenced in a club minutes book, written back in 1865.

As the 19th century turned into the 20th Sale eventually found their spiritual home as they purchased a field in Heywood Road in 1905 and so beginning the development and evolution of one of the best rugby ground visits you can make.

Sale down through the years became a beacon of the game in the country and the north having a multitude of internationals wearing the famous blue and white hooped shirts. Cups and honours also followed over the years until there was a re-think and repositioning for club during the mid-90s when the club established a





fully professional outfit playing under the Sale Sharks banner to respond to the changing times in Rugby.

Success followed success for this new entity, but members harked back and wanted to re-establish the community links and create an amateur pathway for all within the club. In strange quirk of coincidence, as the turn of the 20th to 21st century came, Sale FC, the amateur arm of the club, entered the lowest level of the pyramid to leap forward and make a rapid return the higher echelons of league rugby. I for one applaud and welcome the initiative that has seen the return of that great Sale FC moniker to league Rugby.

Sale's season so far to date has been one of strange early form to coming into this game (typically) arriving in red hot form. Sale FC lie currently 13th in league having played 9 games winning two and losing seven. They have amassed 12 league points with 139 for, 215 against having a negative 76-point difference.

The defeats came at the hands of Leicester Lions (A), DMP (H), Chinnor (A), Cinderford (A), Plymouth Albion (A), Richmond (H), and Birmingham Moseley (A).

The wins have come from games with Blackheath (H) and the most impressive of all was the win last week at Heywood Road beating the very highly fancied Rams Rugby 29–17.


As has been stated before the league this season is turning out to be one of most competitive leagues for some time, with teams capable of taking points from each other regardless of form or where you are in the league.

On the road with Sedge

Last week, we travelled to Darlington Mowden Park to face an in-form side who are currently shooting up the league. This was only our second visit to the Darlington Arena and in the prematch discussions during the week around the league, much was discussed and anticipated about this clash, between two teams who have a panache for free flowing aggressive running rugby. Boy, they were not wrong, in what turned out to be a very good game of rugby.

The home side, taking advantage of a Sedgley missed tackle straight from the kick off, camped out within the Tigers 22 for the first five minutes. This pressure finally brought points, when Callum Pascoe sniped through, for the home sides first converted try on 6 minutes.

Tigers during this opening period had to dig in deep as wave after wave came at the Claret and Gold line, but the line held firm. An exchange of penalties for both sides in this first quarter had the score at 10 – 3 for the home side with nothing really between the teams.

The force that came to the fore was the impressive Tigers pack, who started to turn the tide of the game with a very good, disciplined scrum and a withering line out. With Warren Seals returning to his old stomping ground, and with his kicking radar knowing the area well, he was soon kicking the Tigers pack into great areas for line out ball.

On 26 minutes a kick to corner was taken off the top by second row Bob Birtwell, which was then quickly followed up into a driving maul with hooker Adam Mallison going over for Sedge's first converted try.

Tigers pack was now running amuck, breaking the home lines and finding willing runners to come through the gaps which saw number 8 Tom Ailes, who had just returned from his yellow card in 19th minute, returning with one of his trademark runs steaming over the line for Sedge second but unconverted try on 34 minutes.

Tigers kept up the pressure but could not force any more points even with DMP down to 14 following a yellow card for a high tackle, as the home side defence rallied and held firm until the break.

If the second quarter of the game was all Sedgley Park, the second half of the





game was all Darlington as right from the re-start they went straight for Sedge's jugular. There were some top performances from DMP but the stand out performance, and most pivotal one was from their scrum half Callum Pascoe, as he took the game by the scruff of the neck.

It was his movement and momentum that got the home side moving with some brilliant snipes down the fringes causing chaos in the Tigers defence and in turn finding the likes of back row forward Oliver Hodgson, who had a top game, and also the dancing feet of the illusive second row forward Oscar Usher. Both players had a huge impact on proceedings, but it was the DMP inside centre Ben Franklin who took advantage as he ran in a well work try on 53 minutes.

Sedge seemed well in the contest but could not find the consistency they had in the first forty from the set piece nor was the tactical kicking as accurate as it lacked the hang time or depth to apply maximum pressure we had been used to. This resulted in the opposite effect, inviting pressure back onto ourselves as it came back over and over again.

However, despite this Tigers were still looking to turn the corner in the game but the crushing blow came in the 66th minute from an unfortunate second yellow card of the game, and with Sedge down to 14, DMP did not need a second invitation to take advantage as they quickly saw off their opposition with a

converted try from Yaree Fantini on 68 minutes followed by a penalty on 71 minutes.

A consolation penalty from Warren Seals on the last play of the game gave Sedge a deserved losing bonus point. On another day this could have been a tough hard-fought win, but this improving DMP side would not lie down and duly came out deserved winners in a hard fought contest.



The top four stayed the same except for the change of Albion on top of course, but in fifth, sixth and seventh place Blackheath, Birmingham Moseley, and Rosslyn Park respectively all had good wins closing the gap on fourth placed Sedge to seventh placed Rosslyn Park down to just three points.

Last seasons relegated championship side, Richmond are still struggling to find consistent form and their loss last week to Blackheath sees them in eighth place. DMP are making up for lost time in ninth place and in my opinion, it will not be long before they will be elbowing their way into the top of the table as they look to be in red hot form now. In the final pack of teams our visitors today Sale is in thirteenth place however there is not much in points difference between Sale and Cinderford in tenth who are on 21 points. Bishops Stortford and Taunton Titans sit in-between Cinderford and Sale with Leicester Lions in bottom place on 11 points.



At the last home game against Leicester Lions, Matt Riley became the player with the most appearances for a single Club in the Pro era. This extends to both sides of the English Channel. He has just passed Exeter's 'One Club Man', Richard Baxter. He is leaving behind some very exalted company, as can be seen from the list.

Today is Matt Riley's 426th game for the club. 400 games these days is unheard of, and with one club, bearing in mind the high intensity and the level of physicality in the modern game. This puts Matt in a group of only 4 who have made it past 400. In our club, and in modern terms, he is unique, as he is in a group of one.

Matt told The Rugby Paper "I loved the fact that at Sedgley there were some really good players and it was still a really good level. It was serious, but still not full on. You could still have a couple of beers after the game. You trained Tuesday and Thursday for a couple of hours and I loved that escape from the 'Rugby Bubble' and just going back to the old-school type of ways. Also the people there were great."

Former teammate Paul Arnold had invited him to join the Lions squad that plays in the annual Bermuda Rugby Classic Tournament. Matt was in no doubt where his loyalties lie.

In his time here, he has represented England Counties on many occasions, and I know all at Sedge felt immense pride as he is one of ours representing England, even though Widnes RUFC may try to claim that honour. Not a chance!!! Sedge through and through. He was always a constant selection for the county too, taking it seriously, as you should. That is Matt, someone who does take things seriously on the field, his preparation and commitment to the cause second to none. Off the field a great bloke, great Captain and noisy laugh on booming down the coach on away days.

Matt has stuck with Sedgley through thick and thin. From the glory days of playing the likes of Northampton and Harlequins in the Championship, to getting relegated to National 2. "I could probably have left plenty of times earlier on and won titles with other clubs, but in all honesty, it wouldn't have meant as much to me as staying with my club" he revealed.

"I think what we did last year, in winning promotion from National 2 North, with a group of five or six of us who've been there a long time and the new breed coming through, means far more to me than winning something with a new club that I don't have feelings for."

So, how long can Matt keep going? "I'll Play as long as my body allows me to." he said.

In time, his brother Andy joined Matt at Sedge and the both of them have blossomed and are like an expensive wine, maturing with time and what a vintage they are becoming. Note they are becoming, still more to come yet.



The 5 questions that are asked each week are designed not only to encourage men to talk, but to start to focus on the positives and on strategies to keep moving forward. There is no pressure to answer any of the questions and it is not uncommon for men to just listen for the first few sessions.

The clubs all run on the same format and adhere to the same guidelines. A key principle of Andys Man Club is anything that is said in the club, stays within the club.






Looking forward




Although some areas of the Youth Section are thriving, others are struggling.




The Rugby World Cup has now come to a close. We congratulate South Africa on becoming World Champions again.




App2Tap

DAVE'S DIARY





You must admit, there are few things in life better than a good algorithm. No? The RFU think so, because they have introduced a 'Grassroots Team of the Month' award for levels 3 to 12, and the rankings are calculated from the Electronic Match Card data.

"Electronic Match Card allows everything from tries and points scored to best defensive performance and kick percentage record to be viewed for every team from level three to 12."

I find my excitement bubbling over as I scroll down to discover the October men's results. Here they are:

- Levels 3 & 4 Leeds Tykes
- Level 5 Rossendale,
- Level 6 Ludlow
- Level 7 London Scottish Lions,
- Level 8 Redruth 2s
- Levels 9-12 Harbury (a midlands club).

Each team gets a photo and interview prominently displayed on the RFU website, which is a good thing, of course, and living proof that the RFU does give a damn about the community game.

When a 1st XV hooker and an eleven-year-old ball-boy come into contact, there can be only one winner. Or no winner, in this case. The boy fell over and cried, and the hooker has been given a ban. The game was the Championship encounter between Ampthill and Cambridge, and what seems to have happened is this (gleaned from the minutes of the disciplinary hearing)...

The ball went into touch and the Cambridge 2 approached the boy, who kicked his ball away. There was another ball-boy nearby, so the hooker approached him, but the first boy intervened again, to prevent the Cambridge man from getting that ball either. The hooker pushed the nuisance boy away, he fell over and cried, and that's where we came in.

It does raise a few questions, though. I have considerable experience of eleven-year-old boys – too much! – and I know they can be horrible and brattish, in a group; worse than older teenagers. Put them on their own, in an adult context, and they are almost invariably as good as gold. So what could possibly have possessed this particular boy to behave like this?

I can think of only two possibilities. Either this boy was an unusually horrible specimen; or that the Ampthill club had instructed its ball-boys not to aid the opposition. I suppose it is feasible that

the boy, wrongly, thought this behaviour was required of him. I have to say, I feel more sympathy for the player, who got a six week ban, than I do for the boy, or for his club.

There is a problem in rugby, compared with other games, in that a ball which goes into touch is still 'live', and that no one (not ball-boys, nor replacement players, nor medical staff) should touch it until the players have had their chance. You would not necessarily expect a youngster to know this, so ball-boys need to be briefed. I would hope that the briefing would include the need to present a dry ball to the hookers of both teams, helpfully, fairly and quickly.

I understand that Steve Kay (SKalpy) is i/c ball-boys at Park Lane, and I have never seen anything other than perfect behaviour from any of them. Long may this continue, our touchline a brat-free zone.

Two weeks ago, it was back to league action after a two week break, at home to old rivals Leicester Lions. They, like us, had gained promotion into National League one and had recorded some good wins, especially against top team Rams the week before. Conditions on the day were poor with a very wet, heavy pitch which would make open, fast rugby difficult.

Leicester started strongly putting us under pressure in our half and it was from this that they scored first. A charged down kick gave them a line out close to our line. They kept possession well and touched down under the posts. O-7 up after just three minutes. We hit back, almost immediately, with a well taken try for hooker Adam Mallinson, after a powerful catch and drive from the forwards. Warren Seales added the conversion to level the scores.

We were playing good, controlled rugby varying play between backs and forwards and it was only unnecessary penalties from us that allowed them to relieve the pressure and give them territory and possession. A sharp line break, from flanker Lewis Bradley, took us up to the Leicester 22. The ball was moved quickly right for No 8 Tom Ailes to burst through and score our second converted try. 14–7 up after 20 minutes and looking to extend the lead.

Another penalty for them took play deep into our 22. They went through a number of phases, building momentum and eventually scored out wide on the right to reduce the lead to 14–12. At this point we lost fly half Warren Seales to the sin bin for ten minutes but managed to keep them out. Indeed, a lovely penalty from full back Oli Glasse from 38 metres saw us go into the break 17–12.

Playing down the hill in the second half, we scored first with a penalty from Warren to give us a bit of breathing space 20–12. Leicester looked to move the ball every time they got possession but our line speed and collisions were immense from all the players, pushing them back 40 metres at a time. They got a penalty on 58 minutes but we replied with another from Warren giving us a 23–15 lead going into the last ten minutes.

Another huge defence set from the Tigers saw the Leicester ball turned over for scrum half Jacob Tansey to dive over in the bottom left hand corner and give us our third try. They did score again deep into injury time but the game ended 28–20 to the Tigers and a well deserved four points and our sixth win of the campaign, putting us into fourth place just two points behind Plymouth and Chinnor in second place and six behind the leaders Rams.

This was a solid performance from all of the squad especially after the two week break. We won the collision battle, our line speed was excellent


and our game management was spot on against a good team.

There is more on this elsewhere in the programme.

Last week, we were away to Darlington Mowden Park in our ninth game of the season. The last time we played them was when we were in National one back in 2015. They had a mixed start to the season but had recorded a good win the previous Saturday against top team Rams, so we knew that this would be a hard, physical contest against a well organised outfit and so it proved to be.

They started well taking the game right to us with powerful surges into our twenty two, keeping possession well and building the phases which tested our defences continually. They scored first with a well worked converted try after seven minutes and we had hardly touched the ball at this point. We did manage to get a penalty which fly half Warren Seales converted but they went further ahead with a penalty and we


were now 3–10 down and looking to get a foothold in the game with twenty minutes gone.

It was a difficult first half with a lot of indiscipline, which didn't help, especially as we were down to 14 players for ten minutes following a yellow card. Despite this we were pleased with the scoreline but looking to improve and build a score in the second half.

However this was not to be, as
Darlington came out with all guns blazing,
looking to pressure us every time they
had possession. They scored their
second try with a lovely handling move
wide out on the left to level the scores
15–15.

Another unnecessary penalty by us saw them gain territory and possession deep in our twenty two from which their No 6 dived over giving them a 15–22 lead with fifteen minutes to go.

We received our second yellow card of the afternoon which put more pressure on us and they extended the lead with a penalty to put them 25–15 up with eight minutes to go.

We did get a penalty with the last play of the game which Warren converted but the game ended 25–18 to the home side and well deserved four point win for them.

We did get a losing bonus point but this was a very disappointing performance from the Tigers. We gave away too many penalties, too many poor kicks and poor kick chases meant that we could not get

into the game for large periods and could not stay in the fight. However one relatively poor performance does not make us a bad team. Darlington deserved the win and we have plenty to work on during the week before we play Sale FC at home next Saturday.

This is a big local derby and we are aiming for a much better performance, especially as they had just beaten Rams at home. Please come down and support the Tigers in what should be a great game.







encounter 37–17. This was the period of
Sedge's demise or realignment period
from its heady days in the
Championship back to ultimately
National League Two North.
Richmond on the other hand were on
an upward trajectory having had a bit
of demise and re-alignment
themselves, having been demoted to
the bottom of the pyramid by a once
tougher governing body.
You had to pinch yourself on that first

home game of 2012/13 season at Park Lane. Here was this true bastion of elite club rugby in England here at little old Park Lane. Here was a not so longago Premiership juggernaut. For all the big hitters that had graced Park Lane during our Championship days none had the bigger impact on the professional game than Richmond.



To cap off that first game, we won! it was a very bright highlight in a season which turned out to be a relegation year for Sedge, whereas the 'Old Gold' would go on to get promoted back to the Championship.

I reflect then as I do today on the spirit and tenacity of the Richmond Club. In all the club's history and glory preleagues, and its impact as a winner in those formative years of professional rugby era. For me surely the club's finest hour was that march back to the top. Outstanding.

To establish a progressive and dynamic club ethos of mini to first team pathway for all. For establishing a brilliant platform for the development of girls and ladies' rugby.

That's quite a bit of legacy building. Impressive? You bet.
