


So, we welcome Club back to Park

## Memories from a great day out on the Heath

The day was highly anticipated around the club. Sedgley Park playing Blackheath. Pinch me. Cars were loaded a large section of train was reserved as little old Sedgley Park were heading south to face the oldest club in rugby. Club! Blackheath. Keep pinching me.

I was already down in London staying with my brother John and meeting up with Grant Keers, now sadly deceased,. All three of us were still in utter disbelief of this fixture. Remember, back then, we were not national entity, and never had been. We were a strong developing side in National League Two North Level 4. Blackheath at the time were at Level 2 in the Allied Dunbar Premiership Two, a very high standard of the game. A league full of the great and good of the game.

The previous week, Club had a great performance on the road against Worcester Warriors and that result and the cup game against us was supposed to act as a game changing moment on the fortunes of Blackheath for that season. So said the London Standard on the Friday evening before the game, who even forgot to mention the existence of Sedgley Park, Club's cup fixture the next day.

So, early on the Saturday morning, we travelled with great hope, but a strong realisation of what could be. Up the Thames on a river boat to the Cutty Sark, stopping for pie and mash just outside


Greenwich. Onto the Rectory Ground and our hosts were very warm, welcoming and well prepared for the hordes of Sedgley supporters now descending on them. The Clubhouse bar was rammed, and the special Guiness bar tent was full and in full flow as supporters from both clubs exchanged stories and, in some cases, struck up friendships that last till this day.

The David and Goliath story could not be better summed up as when the announcer (they've got an announcer!) adding to the to the tension and the atmosphere of the day inadvertently cranked it up another level with his geographical gaff 'We welcome our guests today who hail from a suburb in north west Birmingham'. Someone didn't read the match day programme!! And why should he, this lot will be gone soon to some farfetched corner of the pyramid or so he might have thought.

So, with copious amounts of Guinness and Jamesons drunk, purely medicinal obviously and with all from Sedge faithful praying for a miracle but expecting just our honour is kept intact, the game kicked off. This period for Sedge was coming to the end of Bob Kimmins incredible era which had seen tremendous glory with promotion after promotion and a Lancashire Trophy win to boot. A fantastic haul for such a small traditional club.









However, this was not the team of the season or so before. It was still a very useful side, but it seemed that season we had plateaued and maybe, we all thought, just maybe this might be a turning point in the Club league fortunes. The game opened and as expected Sedge came out firing on all cylinders bringing early rewards with a try. The first forty was a duel of equal foes and at halftime Sedge had the edge.

As the afternoon turned into a cold autumn early evening Club started to take the advantage. Line breaks were being made instead of being stopped and the game started to be more orientated within the Sedgley Park 22.

With the game going into the final 10 minutes disaster followed, as Club converted a try to take the game to 21–15 in Club's favour. With the clock ticking down Sedge upped the ante with Rob Moon opting to kick to the corner time and time again. Our lineout was good but so was the Blackheath counter maul keeping Sedge away from the all

important try line.

With minutes remaining the tension had got the better of me and pragmatism kicked in as I went to the bar to order the commiseration round before the crowds came in.

I just got back to the perimeter hoarding carrying the round when Disco Dancing Jon Duncan sprang up from the base beat the first tackle avoided the next before drifting right. Like a bolt of lightning winger Paul Morris came off his wing and took hold of a beautiful offload from Jon to run a brilliant try to the right of the post.

Euporia abounds on the cricket side of the pitch, where the Sedgley faithful had encamped (next to the Guinness tent obviously. Uunfortunately for me, still holding a tray of six pints of Guinness, the euphoria was too much and ill timed. Getting back to the perimeter fencing, and with the surge by all standing by the perimeter





fencing from the try, resulted in everyone being tipped and revolved over to pitch side in a mass pile. This mass heap all topped off with six pints of Guiness. Peter Keers is still waiting for that pint.

The game though was not over, and decorum was required by all as young fly half Rob Moon stepped up to take the all-important conversion kick. The kick was good, victory was ours, as we had won by one point. We had won a major cup game, but little did we know which club would come next. The bigger question though was what would come next.

The bar and the night after the game was brilliant. Blackheath members and supporters were terrific and very encouraging and flattering to us all. The Sedge intercity set, those who came by train that is, set off for a memorable journey home to Manchester which no one now remembers.

It was just the three of us left from Sedgley Park and the night was young so we stayed, drank and laughed whilst all the time the Blackheath faithful (they shall remain anonymous, but the know who they are) were plying us with copious amounts of drinks and a great time.

We were the last to leave and to our eternal shame never paying for a round that night.

So back to the bigger question? What would come next.

That season we finished 8th in the league. We had a little bit extra exposure so much so the season after we were named as one of the beacon clubs around the country. Exeter Chiefs were also awarded that mantle too. We brought in a young Richard Senior, stopping him from going to Sale Sharks and added in giant Cristian Raducanu from Leeds Tykes to freshen up the squad.


At the end of that season, and following advice from Cristian Raducanu, we also eventually brought in a player coach South African, Tim Fourie and former Welsh international Colin Stephens. All this momentum brought promotion in 2000/01 via the play offs.

Eventually this led to more promotions and an eventual five great seasons in the sun at the pinnacle of the game. All this starting from that 'great day out on the Heath. Season changing!!! More like life changing.



This was quickly followed by another breakaway unconverted try from number 8 Tom Ailes on sixty minutes.




#### Previous games against Club

We first met Club in that cup game (not that cup game again I hear) on that frosty misty dark day at the Rectory Field on November 14th 1998. The game which has been recorded for evermore in the Sedgley Park match books as the game that put us on the map. However, and no matter how great that cup result was, our league fixtures against Club have not been worthy of mass celebration, not at all. More like mass depression and angst!!!

From 1998 and as Blackheath bounced back from level two and three and Sedge powered up the league's fixtures and outcomes of those fixtures conspired to The week before our postponed gam keep this much treasured fixture apart for nearly two years as Sedge eventually got to the holly grail of the Championship in 2004/05 season whilst Blackheath settled for a long period of National One occupancy. This resulted in our next and first league fixture between the two clubs to be nearly ten seasons later in 2009.

That game was played at The Rectory Field on October the 3rd 2009 and it was game Blackheath won 35–29. We then played Club another seven times over the next four seasons until our relegation to National League Two North, and





during that period we had a real poor return on results winning just one game on 6th of October 2012 winning 42–22 at Park Lane.

Our final game against Club was later that season in the away fixture where we were took apart by an aggressive 'Club' winning 53–17 at the 'Rec'.

So, in the final analysis we have played Club nine times 25 years winning twice and losing the rest. Good grief!!! What the hell are we celebrating this fixture as a long-lost son returning home? Because it is.

#### Blackheath History


How the hell do you tell the story of the Club who put the Club in club rugby. You can't and if I did I could never give them their due credit and respect for what they have achieved over the decades and what they have gave the game both at club level and international level.

In modern times and I say this as at the beginning of league structured seasons which began in season 1987–88 which was the very first season of league rugby, and Blackheath were pitched at level 2 Courage League National Division Two with all of the London Exile clubs and other London clubs, Richmond, Rosslyn Park and Saracens. The rest of the league consisted of Bedford, Gosforth, Headingley, Liverpool St Helens, and





Northampton Saints so it as a very strong league they began not too far dissimilar to the fixtures they had previously played for many decades. So not much change.

Over the years and until today it would be very fair to say Blackheath would not jump into the club consciousness of the sporting fraternity nor in some cases the rugby community of that big London brand club.

Club had that opportunity but to those of us who care less about big brands and know about these things, but care greatly about heart spirit and development of the greater game, Club will always be that big London club. Others from that time of league rugby saw some of the lesser London clubs, like Saracens for example who have took that big London mantle mainly for their exploits on the field and how they responded to the professional era joining Quins and sadly the now defunct Wasps. (Be careful what you wish for)

Club did find staying and pushing up to the very next level difficult, something they never achieved as it would be in a highly populated area of clubs in what will always be the most competitive area of Club rugby: London. Staying within the top four levels of rugby's pyramid is nothing to look down on. Absolutely not. Developing and having over 20 teams at all levels turning out in the red and black hoopsStaying within the top four levels of rugby's pyramid is nothing to look down on. Absolutely not. Developing and having over 20 teams at all levels turning out in the red and black hoops each weekend is something to triumph and celebrate. This success in playing numbers growth resulted in 2008 the Club purchasing Well Hall sporting complex in Eltham to cope with this demand whilst still using the Rectory Field. In 2016 when the complex was fully finished all Rugby was transferred to Well Hall including all first XV fixtures.

Blackheath is not just a pivotal foot note in history at the dawn of club rugby. They are much more than this. They are a modern ambitious progressive home of rugby for all. No, I will go further a beacon of Rugby Union in an era when we are sadly lacking these beacons.

I think all at Sedgely Park support Clubs ambitions and actions as they are ambitions and actions so close to our hearts too.




#### **Social Calendar**

## DAVE'S DIARY





"Lions and tigers and bears, oh my!" A modern-day Dorothy, returned from Oz, would look down the rugby fixture list with alarm. Sharks and Falcons, Pirates and Saracens, Hawks, Titans and, er, Grasshoppers. Oh my! What is wrong with just calling a club "Club"? I suppose there can only be one of us.

These are the words of journalist Patrick Kidd, writing in the Blackheath – the Club – match programme. Quite right, too. There are lots of clubs, but only one Club. They are up there with Roger Bannister and Neil Armstrong, and no one can take that away from them. Okay, they do go on about it, a bit...

Sedgley's first trip down to Club has become part of our history, together with a Lancashire Cup encounter at Fylde, a couple of decades earlier still.

We travelled in hope, and some expectation of success, that midwinter day in 1998, and were welcomed as the 'Minnows from the North', which must have been worth at least seven points in our team talk. The occasion was the 3rd round of the Tetley Bitter Cup.

In the previous round, Rob Smith's team had beaten Manchester FC 20–17, another club with a 'first' to its name, in this case a joint first, the inaugural interclub match, against Liverpool in 1857, though the Manchester club itself was not formed until 1860, two years after Blackheath. I am confused, but I have never allowed that to worry me before.

If Blackheath underestimated us, that was sloppy of them, because we had already had our growth spurt, from level 7 to level 4, only one down from Club at that time.

I remember it was cold and very dark. Blackheath had impressive floodlight pylons, but with what looked like a 60W bulb at the top of each of them, and in the dying moments our Welsh winger, Paul Morris, streaked over for a try. I have a memory of our talented young Kiwi, Rob Moon, slamming over a goal kick, perhaps the conversion. 22–21 it finished. Never in doubt.

In the following round, we welcomed Wasps to Park Lane, and lost 3-53.

•••

We play the game today with doubts and questions about the future of the top end of the 'recreational game'. We enjoy the brand of rugby produced by our semi-pro players, and the game looks in good health, at National league level.



### DAVE'S DIARY



Clearly all is not well at the levels above. Between the Premiership (supposed to be fully professional, but which has lost three clubs recently) and ourselves lies the Championship, and it is here that conflict is brewing. The RFU management thinks the Championship is failing, and says it has 'poured money' in, to no avail; to which the Championship clubs are relying, "What money?"

Their clubs have been blocked from advancing by a form of ring-fencing by stealth – not that it's subtle, or anything – a list of criteria that no one could reasonably meet, not the well-heeled Ealing Trailfinders, nor Jersey Reds (now defunct), nor Doncaster, nor Cornish Pirates, let alone Caldy or Ampthill.

The RFU is proposing a Premiership 2, which will / would / might include some of these clubs, perhaps, plus revived Wasps, London Irish and Worcester franchises, for that is what they would be. For those Championship clubs who have managed their finances properly, this is a red rag to their bull. Perhaps 'bull' is the apt word.

The battle lines have been drawn. In a recent statement, the Championship clubs affirmed their opposition to a "franchise model which would allow non-meritocratic entry to the proposed Premiership 2," and they stated their unwillingness to commit to a tender process.

The Championship clubs further say their aim is to sustain a second tier of English rugby that adheres to the principle of being open to all clubs who have the ability, aspiration and ambition to compete in it.

They conclude by saying: "Through the history of our clubs, we represent the proudest traditions and values of rugby and so we will continue to build our community relationships and encourage rugby at all levels."

I cannot fault any of that. Let us hope they can maintain their unity when it matters. Meanwhile, we will enjoy the game today, watching talented young men excel at their chosen sport, and leave the petty politicking for another time.

Best wishes for 2024 to all true lovers of the game.



## COACH TALK



We were at home to Birmingham
Moseley in our last game before the
Xmas break. We had beaten them
convincingly at their ground earlier in
the season but their recent form was
very impressive, with narrow losses to
top teams Chinnor and Plymouth in the
last previous two weeks.

A well organised team, who like to play open rugby, and a big, physical set of forwards with a solid set piece scrum and accurate line out. They were lying 6th in the league, just one point behind us, so that we knew that this would be a massive challenge and so it turned out to be.

We started well and went into the lead 3–0 with a penalty from fly half Warren Seales after 2 mins, but Birmingham hit back almost immediately with a converted try after a strong catch and drive from their forwards. They followed this up with another twelve minutes later to extend the lead to 3–12 and looking dangerous every time they had possession.





However, a lovely passage of play down the left, saw winger Andy Riley feed the ball inside for centre Nathan Pope to score under the posts. Warren added the conversion and we were back in the game 10–12, going into the last twenty minutes.

Birmingham looked to keep the ball alive at every opportunity, building phase after phase. A sharp line break by their right winger, beating two tackles, saw them score their third try and extend the lead to 10–19.

Despite this, we hit back three minutes later with a great try for our hooker Danny Maher, after a powerful catch and drive by the forwards. 15–19 with ten minutes to go in the half.

This was a very impressive first half performance from the visitors and another catch and drive from their forwards in the 40th minute saw them deservedly go into the break with a 15–26 lead and a bonus point was secured. We needed a big reaction if we were to get back in the game in the second half.

This came straight away with a beautiful try for centre Nathan Pope (his second), who latched onto an inside pass to race thirty metres and give us our third try. 20–26 down but with the whole of the half to go.

Birmingham looked to throw everything at us, moving the ball quickly to their impressive backs, building phase after phase, but they could not break down the resolute Tigers defence.

A beautiful line break by fly half Warren Seales saw him beat three tackles to touch down near the posts. He converted his own try and we were now in the lead 27–26 and a four try bonus point secured.

This was a wonderful game of rugby for the neutral supporters as the play went from end to end with both teams looking dangerous. A scrum on the half way line with ten minutes to go resulted in our No. 8 Tom Ailes pick up and race 50 metres beating three defenders to touch down in the bottom left hand corner. A wonderful individual effort to give us our fifth try and a final score of 32–26 to the Tigers.

This was an unbelievable second half for the home team and credit to the whole squad who did not let a very good Birmingham side score any points. We go into the Xmas break with a very impressive fourth place in the league and a game in hand over the top three. The previous week, we were on the road away to old rivals Plymouth, a team we had played eight times previously, but unfortunately had not won.

A long five and a half hour trip down to Devon on a day when the conditions were extremely difficult to play open rugby, with a strong wind blowing down the heavy pitch, and driving rain.

Plymouth are a big physical team who had not been beaten at home this season and were lying in third place, one ahead of us in fourth. This was always going to be a difficult challenge after the long journey, but we were confident that we could put in a solid performance and come away with points.

We started the game playing with the elements looking to build a score in this first half before facing the wind and rain in the second half. Early exchanges were pretty even with both teams building phases and keeping possession and it was not until the 26th minute that we got a score on the board with a penalty from fly half Warren Seales putting us three points in the lead.

However, a penalty awarded to the home side saw them kick to the corner from which their big forwards drove over for their first converted try taking the lead 3–7 going into the last ten minutes of the half.

We had the chance to hit back with another penalty but missed the kick and a great line break by captain Matt Riley saw the ball spilled in the tackle which gave Plymouth the chance to relieve the pressure.

We had a number of chances and opportunities in this first half to put points on the board but did not capitalize on them. Plymouth got another penalty catch and drive try just before the break and they went into half time 3–14 up.

This was a disappointing half for us as we had plenty of possession and opportunities to build a lead but we gave away too many penalties which allowed the home side to get out of their half. To add to this we lost No 8 Tom Ailes to a yellow card which meant that we would be down to 14 men for the first ten minutes of the second half. Also, each time they got into our twenty two they came away with points. Something we definitely need to learn.

The second half saw us play into driving rain and a strong wind which made it extremely difficult to get out of our half. Another penalty for the home side on 46 minutes saw them extend the lead to 3–17. Every opportunity we had, we tried to move the ball and put pressure on their defences but the conditions made it almost impossible. To be fair to the home side they played the conditions well and another penalty saw them go for the corner which resulted in another

catch and drive for their forwards. The game ended 3–22 to Plymouth and a well deserved four point win and their unbeaten home record intact. T

his was a disappointing performance from the Tigers, as we had chances in the first half to build a score but did not take them. On a positive note, our set piece play was excellent with a strong scrum and accurate lineouts and our defence sets were powerful especially on our own try line denying Plymouth the bonus point.

The overall effort from the whole squad was immense and cannot be questioned but we need to take our chances when they occur especially in difficult conditions.

This Saturday we are at home to Blackheath, the re-arranged game from the beginning of December. We are looking for a big reaction and a solid performance. It is the first game after the Xmas break so please come down to Park Lane and support the Tigers.
