

Rugby Restructure Update

It's that time of season again and so, following the sad demise of Jersey Reds, the RFU have set out the impact of this on promotion and relegation for 2024/25.

The above precedes current negotiations with Championship Clubs regarding Premiership 1 and 2 reorganisation which is intended for likely, Two leagues of National One North and South. Clarity and agreement on this last point is in very short supply from all parties.

Below sets out what will happen next season in 2024/25

- No club will be relegated from the Championship.
- The winners of National One, currently Chinnor, will be promoted to the Championship.
- The bottom two Clubs in National One, currently Taunton Titans and Bishops Stortford, will be relegated to National Two.
- The top three teams in National Two East, West, and North, currently Esher, Luctonians and

the2025/26 Season.

The championship sides have widely condemned the RFU proposals for the league which, as stated, are due to be in place by 2025/26. The clubs are miles apart on governance proposals, funding criteria and so on. There is a take or leave attitude from the RFU who remain steadfast in their will to have a full professional two-tier Premiership with or without the Championship clubs.

These indecisions could affect the whole structure of National One and below for 2025/26 with a raft of clubs rejoining level three in either a fully National League One format as is now or more Leeds Tykes will be promoted to National League One.

- The bottom three teams in National Two East, West, and North, currently North Walsham, Dudley Kingswinsford and Huddersfield will be relegated to regional leagues.
- The playing records of the current three teams in thirteenth place in National Two East, West, and North will be compared and the best team out of those three playing records will stay in National Two with the other two being relegated to the Regional Leagues. Currently

- the teams in this position are Wimbledon, Newport Salop and Billingham. At this moment Wimbledon have the best record so they will stay in National Two.
- The six winners of the regional leagues will be promoted to National Two leagues East, West and North. These clubs are currently Colchester, Devonport Services, Havant, Oxford Harlequins, Rossendale and York

Please note the clubs and positions relate to when this article was written league positions may have altered since.






Our opponents today are 2 places and 5 points above us.




THE CHAIRMAN

As diaries go, this is quite an empty one, these last few weeks. There were games I planned to attend, but didn't, mainly because I was asleep / knackered after watching cricket on TV all night.

I had intended to watch Sedge Colts against Penrith in the League Cup, but now I am glad I didn't, because we lost our first round match O–24. Sedgley had the honour of hosting the Roses U2O game on the same day, which Lancashire won 21–20.





There was a better game in Ireland, where number 3 Patrice Bell was a big part of the pack that dismantled Wales. All three of these players are contracted to Sale Sharks, and we are just picking up the crumbs from the Premiership high table, but perhaps we can play a small part in the development of future stars of the game.

I am sure someone will correct me if I am wrong, but we have to go back to 2002/03 to find Sedgley home grown players wearing the white of England. Three of them, all together, scrum-half Jonny Appleton, prop Jack Forster and hooker Jordan Page, at U16 level.

On the subject of U2O rugby, three players with Sedgley connections have been on International duty. Prop Asher Opoku–Fordjour turned out for us last season, and has appeared at Park Lane this season, but in the colours of Sale FC. Winger Alex Wills has played for us this season, and he wore the 11 shirt for England, who beat Scotland in a dire match of 34 penalties in the rain and wind of Edinburgh. The plastic pitch made bad conditions worse, but at least England won.






DAVE'S DIARY

Before that, in 1991, prop Phil Donbavand played for England Colts. John Pepworth and I had a memorable day out somewhere in Wales, watching him. It wasn't so memorable that I can recall the actual venue! There were sheep; that I do know. Phil was in the same age– group of SP players as Matt Alcock and Rob Smith, who remain regular supporters to this day.

Going all the way back, almost into prehistory, Tony Bond played some of his early rugby for us, before moving on to higher things with Broughton Park, and later with Sale. He played (and scored two tries) for the North of England in the memorable beating of the All Blacks, at Otley in 1979, and won six England caps as a centre between 1978 and 1982, which was the Bill Beaumont era.

Following his injury-hit International career, Tony played for Blackheath and Askeans.



BISHOP'S STORTFORD




